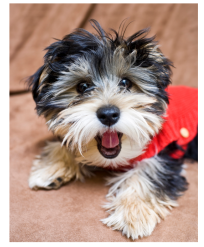


# TOP TEN DOG POISONS

1. Foods – specifically chocolate, xylitol, and grapes/raisins.
  2. Insecticides including sprays bait stations and spot on flea/tick treatment.
  3. Mouse and rat poison – rodenticides.
  4. NSAIDS human drugs – such as ibuprofen, naproxen.
  5. Household cleaners – sprays, detergents, polishes.
  6. Antidepressant human drugs – such as Prozac, Paxil, Celexa and Effexor.
  7. Fertilizers – including bone meal, blood meal and iron-based products.
  8. Acetaminophen human drugs – such as Tylenol and cough/cold medications.
  9. Amphetamine human drugs – ADD/ADHD medications like Adderall and Concerta.
  10. Veterinary pain relievers – specifically COX-2 inhibitors like Rimadyl, Dermaxx and Previcox.

1. Alcoholic beverages
2. Apple seeds
3. Apricot pits
4. Avocados
5. Bones that have been cooked
6. Broccoli in large quantities
7. Candy (particularly chocolate—and anything with the toxic sweetener Xylitol)
8. Cherry pits
9. Chives
10. Chocolate
11. Citrus peels, fruit and seeds
12. Coffee (grounds, beans, and chocolate-covered espresso beans)
13. Currants
14. Eggs that are raw
15. Fatty scraps (can lead to pancreatitis)
16. Garlic
17. Grapes
18. Grape-seed oil
19. Gum (can cause blockage; sugar free gums may contain Xylitol)
20. Ham (because of high fat levels)
21. Hops (used in home beer brewing)
22. Macadamia nuts
23. Milk & dairy products (can use gas and diarrhea)

28. Nuts (choking hazards, and may contain mold)
